Philosophy

Ore City Rebel Band

The Ore City Band is trained in the traditions of the American military bands, with particular emphasis on superior musical performance. This philosophy is based on educational values rather than entertainment standards.

Band does more that teach a student how to play an instrument. Built within the program a student receives a variety of outstanding qualities such as responsibility, dedication, loyalty, group effort, a sense of duty, honesty and dependability. Also promptness, enthusiasm, initiative, and pride in a job well done.

System of Grading

The band grade is determined by general attitude, attendance in performances, participation, and periodic individual auditions/play-offs.

All performances and rehearsals are mandatory for a grade.

I. Purchases:

- A. Marching shoes-no more than \$25.00 (Used shoes are available for free)
- B. Band shirt-no more than \$10.00
- C. Black shoe polish
- D. Band camp \$80.00
- We do not want money issues to prevent any child from being a member of the band.
 Therefore if making these purchases is a problem, all you need to do is contact me and we will work something out. Please do not hesitate to call me.

II. Expectations

- A. <u>Attend every rehearsal, sectional and performance</u>. If you have conflicts let me know as soon as possible and I will do everything possible to work out a solution. <u>Work is not an excused absence</u>. Make sure that your employer does not schedule you to work at the same time as rehearsals or performances. Employers must understand that schoolwork comes first.
- **B.** Arrive on time. This means be in your place ready to march and play. Not just walking in the door or still putting your instrument together etc. it means ready to go. **Band time is 10 minutes early!**
- **C.** Maintain a positive attitude.
- **D.** Give 100% at all times.
- E. Pass all classes.
- F. Play off all required music.
- **G.** Respect the authority and experience of the upperclassmen, Drum Majors and directors. They are here to help you.
- H. Obey rehearsal procedures.
 - a. Have your instrument, music and pencil at every rehearsal.
 - b. Keep your eyes and ears on the director.
 - c. Instruments go up when my hands go up.
 - d. Stop playing when I stop.
 - e. Give your best effort

III. Uniforms:

A. Maintenance

- a. Clean shoes before each performance and apply shoe polish
- b. Hang uniform <u>correctly</u> after each performance. This will keep the uniform from getting wrinkled.
- c. **Inspection**-will take place before EVERY football game and contest, before we march into the stands. <u>Inspectors</u> will be looking for: black socks, black band shoes (cleaned), correct trouser length, neatly pressed uniform, no missing buttons, and clean hat.
- B. Students are responsible for all uniform parts issued to them. All uniform parts must be returned at the end of the school year, or the student will be charged the replacement cost. Uniforms must be left in the uniform room after every performance.
- C. On the first few games, I will allow you to take the jacket off in stands and lay it beside you. **Do not** wear caps, tennis shoes or anything else that **is not** part of the uniform. The uniform should be treated with respect, you should be proud of having the honor to wear this uniform. *Girls may wear small stud earrings while in uniform. That is the only jewelry to be worn, no watches, rings, or large ear rings.

IV. School instruments

- A. Students are responsible for all school instrument repairs beyond normal wear.
- B. All school instruments must be returned at the end of the year.
- C. Students are not to use horns that are not issued to them.
- D. If you are <u>not</u> a drummer, do not touch the Perc. Equipment!

V. Practices:

- A. Attendance at all practices is mandatory to maintain membership in the band.

 Conflicts with other activities will be worked out in advance. It is your responsibility to let me know what activities conflict in advance so I can help find a solution.
- B. **Tardiness** could cause the loss of marching spots and/or dragging the field and/or loss of third quarter break.
- C. **Heat Conditions-** it will be very hot in August, September, and possibly October. If your child has medical problems, i.e. asthma etc., please let me know. If a student can't handle the heat they may become an alternate. This is not a punishment; it is a precaution to protect their health. There will be water at every night rehearsal. They may bring their own bottle of water 1st period. There are several other things you and your child can do; Eat good food. French fries and a coke for lunch will not get you through an afternoon in the sun. Drink lots of water during the day.

VI. Section Rehearsals:

- A. May be called by section leaders with director approval. Advance notices are required.
- B. <u>The director will call sectionals as needed.</u> Every effort will be made to make the sectionals as convenient as possible for all involved and you will be given plenty of notice to work out conflicts.

VII. Pep Rallies:

- A. Band T-shirts are to be worn at all pep rallies by all band members
- B. Attendance is mandatory and for a grade

VIII. Football Games:

- A. No hats (except band shakos) or other inappropriate attire
- B. Band T-shirts are to be worn at football games by all band members
- C. No food or drinks in the stand at any time (water is permitted)
- D. No visitors in the stands unless approved by the band director
- E. Exit stands by going to the end of the row and down the stairs
- F. Uniforms should be worn in full dress unless instructed otherwise by the band director
- G. The current year band shirt must be worn under the uniform coat at all times
- H. The band will only perform in the stands the tunes which have been rehearsed
- I. All band students should be back in the stands after the 3rd quarter break with instrument, flip folder, etc., ready to play at the beginning of the 4th quarter. If you miss the 1st note of the 1st song of the 4th quarter, you will miss the 3rd quarter privileges in the following week
- J. No jewelry should be worn while in band uniform
- K. YOU are responsible for putting up all of your equipment after each game
- L. Long hair must be put up under band shako during performances
- M. Band pants must be worn <u>CORRECTLY</u> at all times. Straps should be up on your shoulders at all times.
- N. No playing on horn in stands unless instructed to do so by a band director
- O. Do not spray perfume, hairspray, deodorant, etc. in the band hall or on the bus

IX. Out of Town Games

- A. All the above rules apply to out of town games.
- B. You may ride home with your parents from out of town games if they are there after the game but the director must release you to them. We must have a note prior to departure from OCHS. Your parent needs to meet you at the bus.

X. Music Playoffs:

- A. Music playoffs will be announced well in advance of the deadline. Anyone not playing off music could: lose their spot and/or lose 3rd quarter break and have their grades lowered by one letter grade for each piece not played.
- B. Playing off music to my satisfaction and on time is one of the items I look at when determining membership of the majorette line.

XI. No Pass, No Play

A. Anyone failing at the end of a grading period will lose their marching spot, possibly for the remainder of the marching season. However, <u>they still must attend all rehearsals</u>. This is a UIL rule, not mine.

XII. Marching positions:

- A. Assigning marching positions will be determined by the following: **IN ORDER OF IMPORTANCE.**
 - 1. Attitude
 - 2. Effort
 - 3. Attendance
 - 4. Playing ability
 - 5. Marching ability
- B. Anyone that is great at all of the above but fails a class will lose their position due to UIL rules. Some new marchers struggle with marching. If their attitude, effort, and attendance are good, they will march at every opportunity. Usually by the end of their first year students have matured and no longer experience marching difficulties. Try not to let them get discouraged. Keep in mind that there is no JV marching band like there is in football. All of these students are on the Varsity Team.

XIII. Loading Crew:

- A. The band director will determine loading crewmembers and captains. There will be 8-12 loading crewmembers as needed. If you would like to be on the loading crew but are not selected, you may ask a band director to see if there is a spot open.
- B. Loading Crewmembers will get extra privileges such as first in line for meals, first to leave rehearsals, and a loading crew dinner after the season under discretion of the band director.
- C. All students are responsible for getting their instruments into the loading area before departure and back in the band hall upon return. If you are not returning with the band you are responsible for getting your horn home yourself.

D. Everyone is responsible for his or her own instrument, accessories, reeds, oils, stick, etc..

XIV. Bus Rides

- A. The bus drivers and chaperones are in charge on the bus. They carry my authority and will be obeyed and treated with respect.
- B. There will be a boy and girl bus.
- C. Do not throw things out of the window or on the floor.
- D. Keep body parts in the bus
- E. Keep your bottom in the seat.
- F. No food or drink without permission
- G. Do not open the back door except in the case of emergency.
- H. Take everything off of the bus at performances and upon returning to school.

XV. Band Booster Club

- A. The purpose of this organization is to support the band and its directors. Keep in mind that we are here for the kids. This must be our focus. Negative comments and actions hurt our band program. Band <u>boosters</u> is just what the name implies.
- B. Any concerns should be discussed with the director first. I am always open to positive suggestions.
- C. Your involvement with this organization is extremely important. There is a lot to do and we need all the help we can get.
- D. You will be receiving information throughout the year about the Booster Club, which meets the 2nd Tuesday night of each month.

XVI. <u>Drum Major and Majorette Membership</u>

- A. You must pass your classes
- B. You must have good self-discipline
- C. Rehearsal conduct must be excellent.
- D. You must practice, play off music, participate at All Region or Solo & Ensemble contest.
- E. You must have a good attitude
- F. You must have perfect or near perfect rehearsal attendance
- G. You must be punctual.

XVII. Letter Jackets may be earned by:

- A. Making the All Region Band
- B. Making a 1st division on a Class 1 instrumental solo at Region.
- C. Making a 1st division on a Class 1 Instrumental Ensemble at Region
- D. Being a Senior Band Member.

XVIII. Social Media:

A. Any student member of an extracurricular organization representing themselves, or their organization, in an unfavorable, questionable or illegal manner through electronic media (i.e. websites, personal home pages, blogs, text messages, chat rooms, or similar websites / files accessible through a server or internet) or using electronic communication devices in such a way as to bring discredit, dishonor, or disgrace on their organization or members of any other school organization including themselves (i.e. camera phones, digital photos, electronic descriptions) may be subject to disciplinary actions determined by appropriate school officials and/or organization sponsors/directors/coaches. Dismissal from the organization could occur when use of social media causes a material or substantial disruption to the educational environment or school operations and/or a substantial interference with team cohesion.

XIX: <u>Tobacco</u>:

A. Any student caught with or using any tobacco product (Weed, Vape Pens, Cigarettes) will be turned into the principal and could result in removal from the band program.
